Youth

Substance Use and Mental Health Counseling

The cornerstone of Bacon Street's programs is its clinical counseling for teens (age 12-17) and young adults (age 18-26) struggling with substance use, co-occurring substance use and mental health issues, or mental health issues that put them at high risk for substance use. We work to build lifelong relationships with the communities we serve and focus on healing for the entire family during treatment.

The Journey Home Project

The Journey Home Project serves youth and families who are struggling with housing insecurity or homelessness and substance use (including alcohol and tobacco). Families can receive substance use and mental health counseling, as well as case management services. Services are offered at all four of Bacon Street's offices; in Hampton, the program is housed in a drop-in day center that also provides showers, laundry, and a hot meal.

The Bridges Project

The Bridges Project is an initiative that combines two proven strategies for youth mental health development: a focused transition program for 9th-grade students and a comprehensive peer mentoring program, resulting in Williamsburg youth thriving in high school and beyond.

Mindfulness

Using the Mindful Schools research-backed curriculum, the Mindfulness program enhances emotional regulation and focus while reducing stress.

Community

REVIVE! Naloxone Training

Bacon Street offers free REVIVE! training to lay members of the community to learn how to recognize and respond to an opioid overdose. Please check our website or Facebook page for upcoming dates. REVIVE! is the Opioid Overdose and Naloxone Education (OONE) program for the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Parents & Family

Parents & Family Support Group

This group is free and open to parents and family members of those struggling with substance use. The Support Group is free, but registration is required: baconstreet.org/parent-family-services/

Strengthening Families

This free, evidence-based program has been proven to strengthen the relationship between 10-14 year olds and their parents or caregivers. Outcomes include improvements in school performance; building skills for handling peer pressure; and reducing risk factors for alcohol, tobacco, and drug use. Meals and childcare for younger siblings provided for all families.

- Fees are established on a cost per service basis and most insurances are accepted.
- A sliding scale fee program allows Bacon

 affordable to anyone who qualifies based on
 income and family size.
- No family is denied services because of inability to pay. Donated funds are available to families meeting requirements for financial assistance.
